Freeland Church: response to domestic abuse

Freeland Church fully endorses the Church of Scotland's domestic abuse charter which 'holds that domestic abuse in all its forms is unacceptable and irreconcilable with the Christian faith and a Christian way of living'.

The Church accepts that domestic abuse is a serious problem which occurs in church families and intimate relationships as well as in wider society.

The Church undertakes to listen to, support and care for those affected by domestic abuse. It is recognised that those most affected by domestic abuse are women but also that a significant number of men also are affected. It is known that many children are adversely affected by the consequences of domestic abuse.

The primary role of the Church in this context is to understand, accept and support those affected by domestic abuse as a means of showing and sharing Jesus' love. The Church does not have the expertise to counsel those affected and will not intervene in cases of suspected or known domestic abuse.
